This policy change affects Extension Services Patrons.

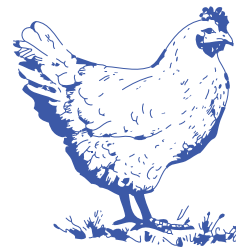
Extension Patrons may no longer renew any DVDS or marked "new non-fiction" which have been borrowed from the regular collection.

Phyllis Barnard, head of the Children's Services division is retiring after 32 years at the library. Thank you, Phyllis, for your service and your hard work!

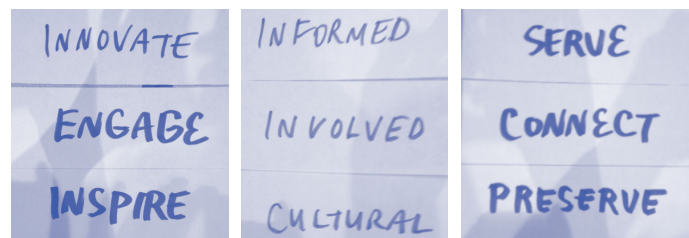
